MINISTRY SITE VISIT COMPLETED

One thing I can say for certain is that the process to become an Ontario Health Team is moving quickly. After submitting our full application on October 9, we received word on October 22 that our in-person site visit from the Ministry of Health would occur on November 5 – meaning we were right back into work mode with two weeks to prepare.

Hosted at the Thamesview Family Health Team site on Grand Ave. in Chatham, we had the opportunity to bring our 120-page submission to life, in 20 slides, for an outreach team of three individuals representing the Ministry. The presentation was followed by about an hour's worth of questions from the panel and an opportunity for physicians to quickly meet with the panel over lunch before heading back to their patients.

There is no question in my mind we effectively showcased our deep collaboration and commitment to this initiative. We had nearly 30 representatives from our CKOHT in attendance, including steering committee members, physicians, nurse practitioners and patient advisors; all of whom took part in our presentation and follow-up discussion with the outreach team.

Individuals from the outreach team remarked on how well written our submission is and were impressed by our presentation and some of the visual documents we've created to support our CKOHT education efforts. The team will now provide a report to the Ministry to be included in the evaluation of our submission. We should hear from the Ministry within the next 2-3 weeks regarding next steps.

With one more milestone in the books, I am confident we are moving toward officially becoming the Chatham-Kent Ontario Health Team in the future.



ADDRESSING POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTATIVE CARE

The CKOHT understands the need to look at and target population health and preventative care. Several of our partners are already focused on addressing social determinants of health and in our submission to the Ministry, we have pointed to several strategies to focus on as an OHT, including:

- Building on successful initiatives such as:
 - Indigenous seniors dental program
 - Primary care for non-English or high-risk newcomers
 - On-site urgent/preventative clinics for isolated seniors
- Advocating that healthy choices are possible; creating supportive environments that prevent disease and protect people
- Working with other potential OHTs and the Ministry to standardize a population health management tool
- Continuing to expand/scale drug awareness and opioid strategies
- · Leveraging and promoting expertise within the Chatham-Kent Public Health Unit
